The Laurels Preserve - May 27, 2023

This was our second visit to The Laurels – a Brandywine Conservancy preserve in southern Chester County. We visited the preserve last October.

This time around we had a rather small turnout. Karen and Brian Mohn and myself. The three us of had the pleasure and benefit of being ushered around the preserve by Clint Mautz and his wife, Rebecca. Clint is head of maintenance at the preserve and was our tour guide in October 2022, as well. It was gratifying to learn that Clint was eager to do the DVFWS tour again as he expected to increase his plant knowledge by being around our plant "experts."

Here are a few highlights of our hike:

Noteworthy species in bloom: Mountain Laurel (Kalmia latifolia); Pinxterboom (Rhododendron periclyemoides); Mapleleaf Viburnum (Viburnum acerifolium); and Jack-in-thepulpit (Arisaema triphylum). One Jack-in-the-pulpit had to be 24 to 30 inches tall!

Of course, we identified any number of ferns and wildflowers. Ferns of note were: Christmas (Polystichum acrostichoides); Cinnamon (Osmudastum cinnamomeum); Interrupted (Osmunda claytoniana); and Rattlesnake (Botrychium virginianum).

Just days before the field trip DVFWS members, David and RoseLynn Malarek, graciously offered to host lunch at their beautiful Brandywine Valley property. So, after our hike, we were joined by the Whitefield's for lunch at the Malarek's and a tour of their spectacular gardens.
